Dr. Ryan T. Anderson is the **William E. Simon Senior Research Fellow in American Principles and Public Policy** at The Heritage Foundation, and the founder and editor of *Public Discourse*, the online journal of the Witherspoon Institute of Princeton, New Jersey.

He is the author of the just-released book *Truth Overruled: The Future of Marriage and Religious Freedom* and the co-author with Princeton's Robert P. George and Sherif Girgis of the book *What Is Marriage? Man and Woman: A Defense*. Anderson's research has been cited by two U.S. Supreme Court justices, Justice Samuel Alito and Justice Clarence Thomas, in two U.S. Supreme Court cases.

Dr. Anderson received his bachelor of arts degree from Princeton University, graduating *Phi Beta Kappa* and *magna cum laude*, and he received his doctoral degree in political philosophy from the University of Notre Dame. His dissertation was titled: "Neither Liberal Nor Libertarian: A Natural Law Approach to Social Justice and Economic Rights."

Dr. Anderson has made appearances on ABC, CNN, CNBC, MSNBC, and Fox News, including appearance on *This Week with George Stephanopoulos* and *Piers Morgan Live*. His work has appeared in the *New York Times*, the *Washington Post*, the *Wall Street Journal*, the *Harvard Journal of Law and Public Policy*, the *Harvard Health Policy Review*, *First Things*, the *Weekly Standard*, *National Review*, and the *Claremont Review of Books*.

Dr. Anderson is currently under contract with Oxford University Press writing a book with John Corvino and Sherif Girgis on religious liberty.
